




The beach they called Gallipoli

This book is about Gallipoli - the place, and what happened on Gallipoli Beach from April to December 1915. Suitable for children ages: 7-12.




The last Anzac (Picture Book)

A young boy visits Alec Campbell, the last ANZAC. He died in May 2002 at the age of 103. This book is based on a true story.




Lest we forget (Picture Book)

This book helps the very young to understand the significance of ANZAC Day.




The Anzac girls: the extraordinary story of our World War I nurses

The author uses diaries and letters to describe the horror of the hospital camps at the battlefield.




Kokoda front line

This book is about Damien Parer, Australia's greatest war photographer, who made a documentary about the Kokoda Front Line.




Anzac Ted (Picture Book)

The story of a teddy bear passed down to a boy from his grandfather who had taken Anzac Ted to war with him.




The heart of centering prayer: nondual Christianity in theory and practice

An analysis of nondual Christianity - in theory and in practice.




One ordinary Sunday: a meditation on the mystery of the mass

The author recounts her experience at one particular Mass, on one particular Sunday, in her home parish in California.




Vesper time: the spiritual practice of growing older

The author uses humour and grace to explore growing old.




Reading, praying, living Pope Francis's The joy of love : a faith formation guide

A guide to Pope Francis's document Amoris Laetitia.




Why did Jesus have to die?: a little book of guidance

For Christians, the crucifixion of Jesus has a profound significance.




All for my children

The author summarises and contrasts the foundations of bioethics in both religions.










The things he said: the story of the first Easter day
